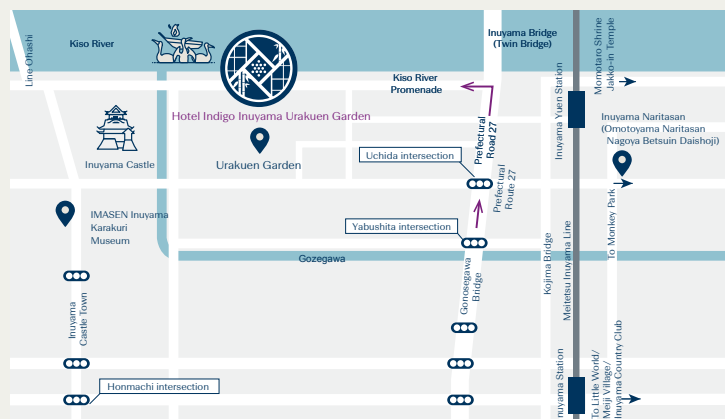
Relax And Discover Something New

A clear, odorless and alkaline hot spring with a pH of approximately 8.5. As you relax, you will admire the striking tiles that feature a Kiso River motif and the open-air bath where you can touch the air of Inuyama.

The Fitness Centre features renewable wood machines carefully selected from US and German forests to minimise environmental impact. Rather than being operated by power, our equipment uses self-propelling and water resistance technology to help you reconnect with your body and nature.

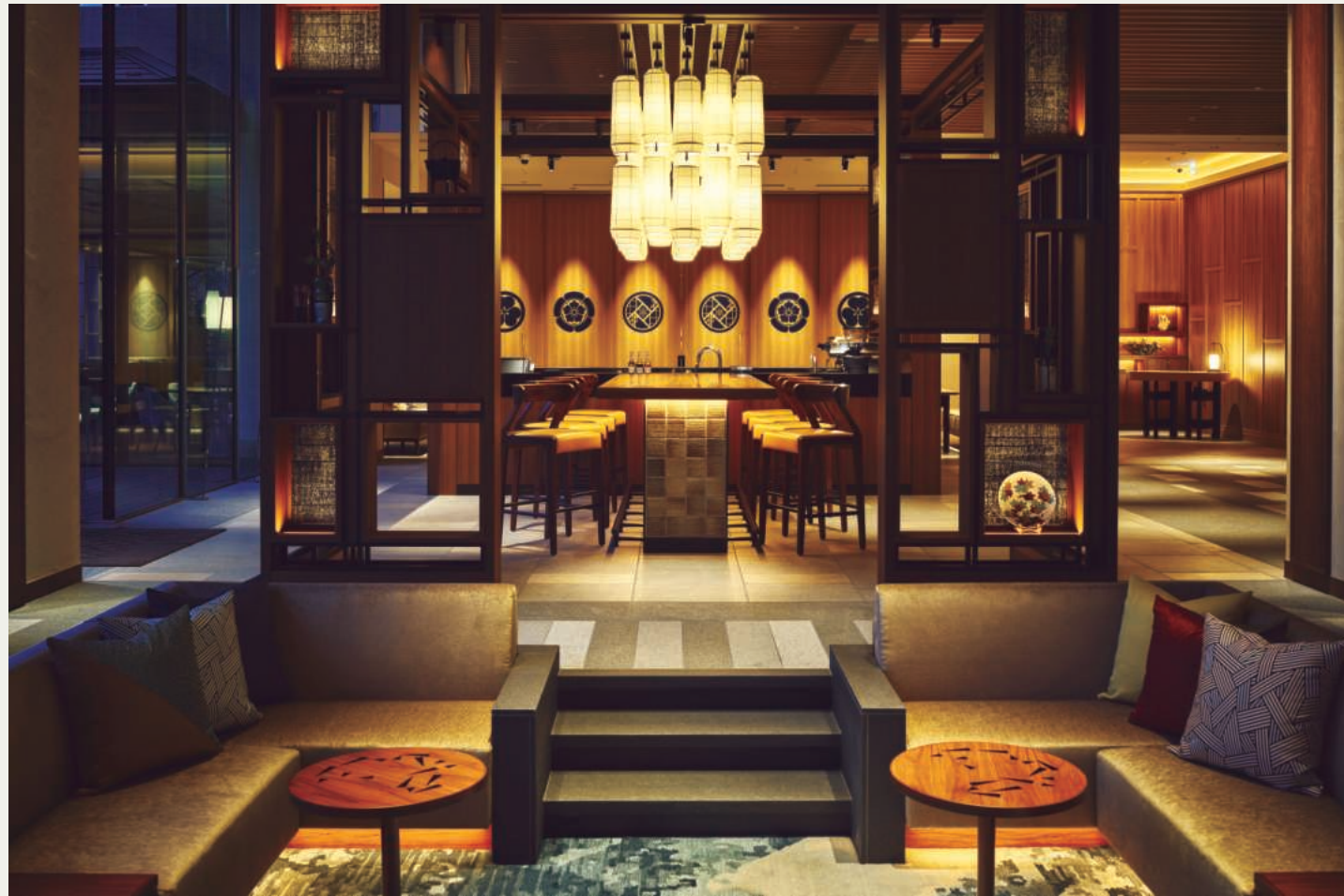

Nestled on the coast of the Kiso River in Japan, is Inuyama. A National Treasure, Inuyama Castle is one of Japan's five iconic castles and has been loved for generations. You'll fall in love with the energy of this vibrant city.

You'll be swept up in the moment and taken to another time at Joan, one of the three finest tea rooms in Japan, and another national treasure. It was built by Oda Nobunaga's younger brother, Urakusai. Oda Nobunaga was a leading figure of the Sengoku period and regarded as the first "Great Unifier" of Japan. You'll experience the vivid history and rich culture of the region.

The hotel's interior features the motif of 13 Yama floats with Karakuri puppets, a specialty of the Inuyama Festival and registered on the UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage list. One of our art walls takes its inspiration from Ukai, a traditional fishing method using cormorants.

Discovering the vibrant and magical culture of Inuyama throughout the hotel will feel like a treasure hunt. Your neighbourhood hosts will enrich your stay even further with heart-warming stories that you will take home with you.
